Dear Friends and Covenant Partners (members) of Union Community Church,

John Calvin, French Protestant Reformer, 1509-1564

John Knox, Presbyterian Protestant Reformer, 1514-1572

Without your blessing extended unto us, we would not able to continue. May this favor serve as a witness to us of your bountifulness and assistance so that we may better understand the fatherly care you have for us.

Moreover, O Lord, we ask that you strengthen us with your Holy Spirit that we may faithfully toil in our work without fraud or deceit, and that we may endeavor ourselves to follow your will rather than to seek to satisfy our own greedy affections or desire for gain. And if it please you, O Lord, to prosper us through our labor, give us a mind also to help those in need according to the ability in which you gave to us in your mercy. And knowing that all good things come of you, grant that we may humble ourselves to our neighbors and not lift ourselves up above them if they have not received so liberal a portion of your mercy as you have given us.

And if it pleases you to challenge us through greater poverty than we would desire, Lord, grant us the grace to know that you will continue to nourish us through Your bounty. Help us to not be tempted to distrust your care, but patiently wait for you to fill us. We ask this not only for our physically needs but chiefly with your heavenly and spiritual treasures, so that we may always have ample reason to give you thanks and to wholly rest on Your mercies. Hear us, O Lord of mercy, through Jesus Christ Your Son, our Lord. Amen.

It will include:


- A presentation of some of the history of Union Church

GOLDEN GIRLS CIRCLE


The Golden Girls Circle will meet on Monday, November 3rd at 11 AM. Please consider joining us if you don't attend a women's circle.
