



Q 1 - Who made you?

A - God

Q 2 - What else did God make?

Q 4 - How can you glorify God?

A - By loving him and doing what he commands.

Q 6 - Are there more Gods than one?

A - There is only one God

Q 14 - Where do you learn how to love and obey God?

A - In the Bible alone

Q 19 - Have you a soul as well as a body?

A - Yes; I have a soul that can never die.

Q 40 - Who can change a sinner's heart?
